MRSPA Community Service Awards FLAGS FOR SCHOOLS Community Service Project



The *Flags for Schools Project* was a rewarding experience for our community. DRSPA learned that several schools did not have adequate U.S., Maryland, or County flags to fly outside their buildings. A flag display outside a school is a quintessential part of the curb appeal. It instills pride and shows that the

school is an important part of the community. DRSPA saw the need and voted to acquire flags.

The project was strongly supported with donations from the community (VFW Post 10159, VFW Post 5246, VFW Post 7460, and American Legion Post 91). DRSPA secured support from Senator Addie Eckardt, Delegates Johnny Mautz, Christopher Adams, and Sheree Sample-Hughes. In addition, DRSPA sponsored a Pit Beef fundraiser and received DRSPA member contributions. The fundraiser was modified to a drive-thru format.

Note from MRSPA: Due to the effects of the pandemic many locals were limited or restricted from engaging in their usual community service projects. As a result MRSPA Community Service Committee decided that no local awards will be presented in 2022.

The 2022 General Assembly session closed on April 11 at midnight. Although many functions of the legislature were held virtually, it was still a very busy and productive session. Many of the bills supported by MRSPA related to our priorities were passed by the legislature and have become law. Others may come back in future sessions for another go.

Our MRSPA Legislative Committee met every other Tuesday during the session and followed many bills related to our legislative priorities. Now that the session is over and bill signings are complete, we have the results of the work of our committee and the legislature in our final Legislative Update of the 2022 session for you. We hope you will take a few minutes to review the Update.

Thank you for your interest in our legislative actions as we work to protect your defined benefit pension and other benefits, and to keep our Legislative Priorities before the legislature.

2022 Retirement and Pension System COLA

Employees' and Teachers' Pension Systems o 3% on the portion of the allowance based on creditable service earned before 7/1/2011 and 2.5% on the portion earned on or after 7/1/2011 • Employees' and Teachers' Retirement Systems a 4.698% (except for bi-furcated payees, who will receive 4.698% on the portion of the allowance based on creditable service earned before they elected to bi-furcate and 3% on the portion earned after they elected to bi-furcate).

This increase will take effect on your July 2022 pension deposit.

<u>Find Cheap Gas</u>: We'll remind you again about checking for lower gas prices. According to GasBuddy, Monday is the cheapest day of the week to fill up on gasoline. Prices on Saturday and Sunday are typically higher. Don't forget about other ways to save big— **Gas Buddy.com** finds the cheapest gas prices near you!

It's Time for Spring Cleaning, Spruce-Up and Scams!!

There are a lot of people working out in their yards and a lot of people working around neighborhoods. Be aware of someone approaching you, offering to do a job with "leftover" materials at a great price! If it seems too good to be true.....it usually is! Ask for references where they performed the job and don't give out any of your information, especially credit card information, if they offer to do the job at a super low price by obtaining a deposit from you. Many scammers will tell you that the offer is only good that day. Don't be pressured! Any work that you need done should be checked out in advance. Also be wary of strangers coming to your door offering to clean up your yard and asking permission to come inside. If you don't know them, don't let them in. Don't open your door and give anyone an opportunity to push past you. Be vigilant of people saying they locked their phone in the car and need to use your phone. It's unfortunate that we have to be so wary, but in today's world, we need to be safe first!

I believe it was in the spring of 2017 that we began making and promoting The Little Free Libraries Project in Dorchester County. We wanted to provide free books to all ages throughout the county. As retirees, promoting literacy is an on-going goal.

Many people in the community helped make little libraries and donate books for them. The first one was done by Debbie White, at the General Store in Woolford. From there, DRSPA (then DREA) began helping organizations and individuals put up libraries throughout Dorchester. Today we have over 20 erected and three more on order. You made the difference by donating books and helping create our Book Depot, a warehouse of all donated books.

MEMBERSHIP NEWS FROM MRSPA

Recruitment Incentive:

MRSPA is continuing to offer a \$10 gift card to ANY member who recruits a NEW member who signs up for DUES DEDUCTION. All you do is get the NEW member to complete an application form, signing up for DUES DEDUCTION, and then WRITE YOUR NAME on the application before sending it to MRSPA. MRSPA will send you a gift card. You can recruit as many NEW DUES DEDUCTION members as you like! Just remember to put your name on each application! The NEW member who signs up for DUES DEDUCTION will also receive the ONE-TIME \$10 reduction in state dues, so their state dues will be \$35 for 2022-2023. Remember that local dues are additional (\$10 for Dorchester). We are calling on ALL members to assist us in this recruitment effort!

Switch and Save Invitation:

MRSPA has extended an invitation to cash members to switch to dues deduction for 2022-2023. If they make the change, they are eligible for a one-time \$10 reduction in state dues. They would pay \$35 for state dues for 2022-2023, plus their local dues amount. Members need to complete and return Dues Deduction Authorization Form, which is available on the MRSPA website under Switch and Save (https://www.mrspa.org/switch-and-save).

BOOK DONATIONS MADE IN MEMORY OF THE RUARK FAMILY

Teena Ruark Gorrow, a local retired educator and Dorchester County native, recently donated three of her published works to the Dorchester Retired School Personnel Association. She is the daughter of Paul and Ellen Ruark, and Paula Ruark Gibb's sister. Teena donated these works in loving memory of her family members.

Her father, co-owner and operator of Ruark and Ashton, Inc., Seafood Packing Plant of Hoopersville, inspired Teena to become an educator and follow in her mother's footsteps. Mrs. Ruark served as a Dorchester County teacher and administrator until her retirement in 1976. Teena's sister was also a career educator with Dorchester County Public Schools, serving as a teacher and administrator.

With more than three decades of professional experience as a Maryland educator herself, Dr. Gorrow is Professor Emerita of Teacher Education at Salisbury University where she instructed graduate and undergraduate courses in the areas of classroom management, education foundations, classroom assessment, and cooperative learning prior to her retirement in 2018. Her campus leadership roles included co-chairing the Department of Teacher Education and coordinating the University's Regional Professional Development Schools Program. Before joining the Education Faculty in 2000, Gorrow served as a teacher, school principal, and central office administrator with Talbot County Public Schools.

Teena donated the following three books to our Book Depot which were published by Schiffer Publishing and co-authored with Craig Koppie of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service:

- Inside a Bald Eagle's Nest, a 2014 Green Earth Book Award gold medal winner, features a photographic and factual journey into the Eagle's entire nesting season. A curriculum guide, developed by Matt Snyder (3rd grade teacher at Princess Anne Elementary School) and Taylor Estes (3rd grade teacher at East Salisbury Elementary School) has also been included to accompany the book.
- Inside an Osprey's Nest, a 2017 Green Earth Book Award silver medalist, features a photographic and factual account through text and images of the daily activities taking place at an Osprey's nest in Kent Island. This book is a timeless treasure which documents the amazing parenting skills and charming characteristics of Ospreys. An interloper appeared at the nest that the family adopted!
- Mr. President and The First Lady: The DC Eagle Cam Project, was written in cooperation with the American Eagle Foundation and features a pair of Eagles nesting in a tulip poplar tree at the U.S. National Arboretum. The raptor parents were named by the public because of their proximity to the White House.

The books, all true raptor stories featuring local bird families, were written to accompany STEM initiatives and designed to complement nest cam viewing. Gorrow and Koppie observed nest activities, documented the raptors' activities, and used photographic lenses to capture original photography without disturbing the birds. These books were developed for children of all ages and present stories through pictures for younger audiences. They include glossaries and other interesting appendices.

INGREDIENTS:

Box of white cake mix 2 tablespoons milk 2 c. blueberries 1 qt. strawberries 1/2 c. powdered sugar 2 c. water 8 oz. whipped topping 2 8-oz. cream cheese

1 3-oz. blue gelatin 1 3-oz. red gelatin

Poke holes in the top of the cooled cake.


